


CHALLENGE COMPETITION








Scottie Ladies, Three from South West Sydney, were off to the Scottish Terrier Breed Stand at The Dog Lover's Festival at Homebush.

I set off in my trusty old Corolla Hatch with my boy 'Morgan Stark' to pick up Jess. Jess was in her tartan skirt, with a blue Scottie on her top, and of course, picked up her boy 'Aleister' (one of Morgan's brothers). Caffeine in tow, we pick up Jaede on the way with her 13-year-old Scottie boy 'Angus' staying at home, as he had not been very well of late*.

Jaede in her awesome black and yellow Scottie t-shirt being club colours, iced latte in hand, and off we go. The best I could do was yellow and black nails with Scottie decals. Three ladies and two Scotties pups and 'Angus' in our heart, full to the brim in my hatchback, drive full of happy Scottie talk, to Olympic Park.

As the day came to a close all four weary humans and three tired Scotties wandered back to the car park.


